

# E.P.I.C Program Available at Your Co-op

The **Efficiency Plan & Improvement Commitment** (E.P.I.C Program) is a new program offered through your Cooperative. SEC is embarking on this home energy efficiency program in an effort to assist our member-owners in making significant improvements to their home's energy efficiency. Ultimately, we are hoping that this will result in lower electric bills and a better quality of home life.



In order to accomplish the goals and efficiency gains of the E.P.I.C. Program, SEC has developed a strategic partnership with Precise Building Performance (Precise), LLC, out of Lawton, Oklahoma.

To sign up, visit our website at www.se-coop.com and hover on the REBATES tab at the top of the page. A drop-down menu will show a list of rebates that are available through SEC. At the top of the list, you will see the E.P.I.C Program. Hover over that tab and then a new drop down will appear with "Program Guidelines" and "Registration." Click on "Registration" and fill out the form! If you need assistance with filling out the form, please give us a call at 580-745-9463 and we will be more than happy to help you.

Once a Member signs up for the program, a professional energy auditor from Precise Building Performance will call to schedule a time for the FREE Home Energy Audit. The assessment is valued at \$275 which your Co-op is absorbing the cost in order to better help our Members.

Precise will conduct three specific assessments at the home: 1) Blower Door Test, to measure the air infiltration to the home; 2) Duct Blaster Test, to measure the integrity of the duct work; and 3) A visual inspection of the attic insulation. At the conclusion of the energy efficiency assessment, Precise will inform member of the results of the assessment. Members can expect a thorough ex-

# **Meter Tampering Is A No-No**

# DO NOT TAMPER WITH YOUR ELECTRIC METER

Meter tampering can result in electric shock, is illegal and increases electricity rates for other co-op members.



If you know or suspect that someone has tampered with their meter, please contact us immediately. We take meter tampering very seriously at the Coop. Not only can it cause bodily harm or possible death, it can result in legal issues as well.

We understand that under certain circumstances, a meter seal will need to be broken. You MUST call the Co-op first to let us know that you or a licensed electrician will be doing repairs to the electric system on the Member's side of the meter (anything that runs from the meter to the INSIDE of the residence or structure is considered the responsibility of the Member). Once you have called, we will make note on your account. When the work is done on the Member's side of the meter, you MUST call the Co-op once more so that we can come re-seal the meter for you.

"Additional charges, possible fines from law enforcement or even the possibility for the removal of all electrical equipment from the property are just a few results of meter tampering," said Randy Cloyd, SEC Office Manager. "In the worst cases, a Member can end up facing possible jail time, serious injury or even death," he added. When someone tampers with a meter, it costs not only the person doing the tampering, it costs all Members as well when repairs are needed.

If you suspect that a person is tampering with their electrical meter, please call the Co-op immediately at 580-924-2170 so that we can verify through a system check. All callers will remain anonymous.\*\*\*

## **Pole Inventory Update**

GPS inventory by Davey Resource Group (DRG) began on February 19th for the Southeastern Electric infrastructure.



The East Circuit of the Yuba Substation is where DRG is currently focused.

This includes the areas of Yuba, Utica as well as Albany

and westward. Once the East Circuit of the Yuba Substation is completed, the next direction will be the West Circuit.

DRG is easily identifiable by their bright vests and well-marked vehicles which will have the Southeastern Electric logo on them. The use of ATV's will also be necessary to reach overgrown or hard to navigate areas.
