Quick Tips to Avoid High Winter Bills

Looking to lower your bills this winter? Use the 10 tips below to conserve energy.

Seal air leaks and insulate well to prevent heat from escaping and cold air from entering your home.

Reduce waste heat by installing a programmable thermostat.

Turn off lights when not in use.

Lower your water heater temperature. The Dept. of Energy recommends using the warm setting (120 degrees) during fall and winter months.

Unplug electronics like kitchen appliances and TVs when you're away.

Open blinds and curtains during the day to allow sunlight in to warm your home.

Close blinds and curtains at night to keep cold, drafty air out.

Use power strips for multiple appliances, and turn off the main switch when you're away from home.

Wash clothes in cold water, and use cold-water detergent whenever possible.

- Replace incandescent light bulbs with LEDs, which use at least 75 percent less energy.

Cooperative Home Energy Efficiency Program (CHEEP)

- •Members can receive up to \$900 in pre-bates
- •Co-funded program with Western Farmers Electric Co-op
- •Members may choose On-Bill Financing for improvement costs
- •Visit www.se-coop.com or www.oknm.coop for more details and registration

Air Source Heat Pump Rebate Program

- Available to new home and replacement units
- •Tiered pay-out schedule with a *max* of \$150 per ton (5 ton cap)
- Units MUST meet Energy Efficiency Ratings
- Available for dual fuel units

Ground Source Heat Pump Rebate Program

- Available to new home and replacement units
- •Pay-out with a *maximum* of \$200.00 per ton (5 ton cap)
- •Manual J report is required for this rebate
- •Due to the strict requirements of this rebate, please contact the Co-op for info

Central A/C Rebate Program

- Available to new home and replacement units
- •Tiered pay-out not to exceed \$500.00 (5 ton cap)

Ductless Mini-Split A/C Rebate Program

- Available to new home and replacement units
- •Tiered pay-out schedule not exceeding \$375 (5 ton cap)
- •Rebate is limited to one qualifying unit every 3 years.

Window A/C Rebate Program

- •30% of appliance net cost (not to exceed \$150.00)
- •All units MUST be Energy Star certified
- New homes do not qualify
- •Rebate limited to one unit every three years

Preventative Maintenance Rebate Program (PMRP)

- Seasonal (April 1st-June 30th)
- •Maximum rebate of \$70.00 per participant
- •Rebate limited to one unit every three years

Recently, SEC hosted a very talented group of students at the Solar Facility! The Durant Middle School, which go by the DMS Green School Class, and Durant Intermediate School also known as the DIS Green Team, and make up what is known as the Durant Green School Program. This program visited our facility in late November.



The Durant Green School Program is led by Elizabeth Callicoat. This class develops innovative methods where students can collaborate together and build systems within their school, such as setting up a recycling station. At both schools, students have the option to take a class where they develop a deeper understanding of stainability

and are given the time and space to work on their ideas.
