

Board District Re-Alignment

After many months of planning, SEC's Board of Trustees have finished an extremely challenging project of realigning much of the eastern and northern boundaries of the Board Districts. The Board Resolution to re-align the districts was presented at the January 24, 2023 Board of Trustee monthly meetings where it received a unanimous vote.

With two District Trustee vacancies occurring in 2022, the Board of Trustees, guided by SEC's By-Laws, decided that a re-districting and a reduction of the number of board districts would be an appropriate action to take on behalf of the Co-op membership. With the ease of communication being what it is today, the ability for each Trustee to stay in contact with their Members is accomplished will little difficulty.

One of the driving factors behind the decision was the inequity of member representation. In the central and west portions of Bryan County, Trustees have a much higher number of members in their districts, while other Trustees in the eastern and northern portions of SEC service territory have fewer members that they represent. The geographical re-alignment of the districts, along with the reduction of the number of Trustees will make great progress in reducing this inequity gap.

The Board Districts that are impacted by the re-alignment are <u>Districts 3, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9</u>. SEC's new Board Districts will be 1 thru 7 as follows:

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Have You Downloaded SEC2Go?

By now you have probably read or heard us mention our new mobile app! If you haven't already, you need to download the SEC2Go mobile app from your phone's app store. Once installed, you are able to log into the app and access your SEC account. Services that can be accessed through the online Customer Portal at www.se-coop. com can be viewed through the use of the app!

You can pay your bill, view your payment history, retrieve your PrePay account balance, set up customized alerts, and access your energy usage graph. Alerts can be set up and customized for:

- due date reminders
- past due balances
- •insufficient funds alert
- •notifications for when changes have been made to your account
- payment confirmation
- and even high energy usage alerts

Possibly one of the most handy features of the new app is the ability to report an outage through your smart phone or tablet! Users can log in and tap on "Services" followed by "Report an Outage" under the menu. Enter a phone number you can be reached at if necessary-then tap the circle next to the word "Yes" when asked if your power is off. Lastly, provide any comments that you may feel would be helpful to the lineworkers about the outage. Be sure and tap the blue "Report an Outage" button at the bottom of the screen when you have your information entered.

If you have already created an account to pay your bill online, you can use the same log in credentials to access SEC2Go. If you have not set up your online account, you will need to call us at 580-924-2170 or 580-745-9463 to verify there is an e-mail address on file along with a social security number. Once those are verified and entered, you will be able to set up access. If you need assistance or run into a snag, please call Kevin at 580-745-9463!
